# THE THREE OF US

## General Reflection

- a. Do you see any parallels between Jesse's wishes for his children and God's wishes for us, His children?
- b. There are communities on Jesse's map without a Jesse's Hardware store. What are some places you know of (locally or around the world) without a church?

#### Personal Connection

- a. Jesse's invitation to Holly changes her life. Have you ever received a potentially life-changing invitation? Did you accept it? If so, how did it impact the course of your future?
- b. Can you see the image of Christ in the life of Emma? How?
- c. Can you see the image of the Holy Spirit in the life of Holly? How?
- d. How is the dynamic of your family similar or different to Jesse's family?

#### The Word

#### a. Ephesians 4:22-24:

As followers of Christ, this is a good reminder of the first, big step we took, accepting the invitation to be made new. Why is it important to God that we put away our former lives? What is God trying to accomplish? Are you still waiting to respond?

#### b. Acts 1:8:

This passage records Christ's final words to all who follow Him, before His ascension. What does this verse mean? What is it telling us?

# AN OPEN INVITATION

## General Reflection

- a. How does Jesse's description of the Jesse's Hardware brand compare with the way people in your community see the Christian church? What is similar? What is different?
- b. Some of Jesse's children are faster decision makers than others. Are you typically someone who decides quickly, or takes more time? Why?

## Personal Connection

- a. Do you see yourself in any of Jesse's children? Which one(s)? Why?
- b. Which person in your life knows you best? Would you rely on this person to advise you in life? Why or why not?
- c. Jesse tells his kids to bring their full lives and selves to the company. How does this compare with your understanding of God's call for us to join His work in the world?

## The Word

#### a. Matthew 4: 18-22:

Calling His first disciples into action, Jesus asks these fishermen to instead be "fishers of men." They went immediately, He called, and they acted. How have you responded in action to Christ's call on your life? Did it take some time, or was your response immediate?

#### b. Matthew 5: 13-16:

Christ uses two different metaphors back-to-back to explain who we are and why we're here. What are the consistencies between salt and light? How do you reflect these ideas in your life?

## General Reflection

- a. What do you think Evie wants out of life? What is her deepest longing?
- b. What is the false message Evie believes about herself? How does that impact her thought process surrounding Jesse's invitation?
- c. If Jesse hadn't asked Evie to join the family business, do you think she would have eventually suggested it on her own? Why or why not?

#### Personal Connection

- a. Evie asks Addison, "Do you ever wonder why God put you here on earth?" Have you ever asked yourself that question? What was going on in your life in that season? What did you learn? Are you wrestling with that question today?
- b. Evie tries to act like she's got it all together. Have you ever attempted to maintain a perfectly polished life? If so, how did it impact your faith? How did it impact your relationships?

c. Like Evie, have you ever spent time honestly reflecting on your character and/or personality? What would God say about your self-assessment? If you are comfortable, share some of your reflections.

# The Word

#### a. 1 Peter 2:9:

Scripture states that all believers – including you and me – have been chosen for a purpose. What is that purpose and how do you live it out?

#### b. Matthew 28:18-20:

On Easter night, after rising from the dead, Christ appears to His disciples and gives them a Great Commission — instructions for what all His disciples will do going forward. How would you describe this "Great Commission?" Since we have chosen to be disciples of Christ, what then, is our job? How is this passage similar to what we read earlier in Acts 1:8?

## General Reflection

- a. What do you think Dave wants out of life? What is his deepest longing?

## Personal Connection

- a. Like Dave, have you ever thought the cost of following God's plan was too great? Have you worried that you would have to give up your own goals and dreams to fulfill God's? Reflect on your personal experiences.
- b. Dave's friend proposes that perhaps there's another way maybe Jesse isn't asking for an "all-or-nothing proposition" but a "yes, and." What might a "yes, and" situation look like in your life?
- c. Dave gravitates toward the familiar. He likes to play it safe and maintain his independence. Share about a time in your life when you took a big risk or leaped out in faith. What did you learn from that experience? What did you learn about God?

#### The Word

#### a. Ephesians 2:10:

Scripture says we are God's "handiwork," created to do "good works." What does this mean to you? How do you live out your life – and your true nature – for the purposes of God?

#### b. 1 Corinthians 12:12-20:

The author, Paul, reminds us that each of us serves a purpose. As you consider God's work in the world, what can you do that others cannot do as easily? Is there something from your past which makes you uniquely qualified to connect with others who have a shared experience?

# General Reflection

- a. What do you think Zach wants out of life? What is his deepest longing?

## Personal Connection

- a. Zach hesitates to accept Jesse's offer because he doesn't know what to expect. Have you ever regretted saying no to an opportunity because you didn't know how it would turn out? What lesson(s) did you learn from that experience?
- b. Zach wants to prove himself to Jesse and earn his place in the company, but the way performance is measured at Jesse's Hardware is a little unorthodox. Have you ever tried to prove yourself to God? What did that look like and what was the result?
- Words have incredible power to shape our identity and self-worth. Share a time when you allowed the words of others to impact

- your spirit negatively or positively. Then take a few minutes to reflect on your God-given identity in Jesus Christ. What characteristics come to mind? Choose one that you want to focus on this week.
- d. What would it look like to wake up each day firmly rooted in your identity as a child of God? How could that change how you handle criticism, failure, or self-doubt?

## The Word

#### a. Galatians 1:10:

What does this verse mean to you? Who are you trying to please?

#### b. Matthew 17:14-21:

Being a disciple requires exercising our faith muscles. It requires stepping into situation because God asks us to and having faith that He will be with us as we obey. How do you stretch your faith muscles? When have you stepped outside your comfort zone to be used by God?

- c. Do others know that you are a Christian? Is there a disconnect in your life between who you are in public and what you do when no one is watching? Why or why not?

## The Word

#### a. Romans 8:35-37:

His love for us and His love through us give us what we need to be "more than conquerors." Where do you need this reminder in your life right now?


#### b. Ephesians 6:10-13:

- c. Mo's wife says, "Sometimes when you give up all control, things come together in ways you never could have possibly imagined." Do you agree? Why or why not? Have you ever relinquished control to God and been amazed by the outcome?

#### The Word

#### a. Matthew 6:27-34:

When you consider investing in God's work with your full life, what worries you most? How have your worries impacted your participation (or lack of participation) in God's plan?

#### b. 2 Corinthians 9:7-8:

How do you view your finances? Do you see yourself as the creator, the owner, or the steward? Do your actions align with your beliefs when it comes to financially supporting God's work in the world?

Considering the roles of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, how would you describe each person of the Trinity? Why did God send us the Holy Spirit?


#### b. Romans 8:14-16:
